AWA & AFW ANNUAL AWARDS

Each spring, the U.S. Air Force Director of Weather announces the winners of the Air Force Weather (AFW) Annual Awards for the previous calendar year. That announcement of the 2009 AFW Awards is in the message below. The Air Weather Association (AWA) also provides special recognition to the individual award winners. These are honored with the AWA John and Barbara Collens Award for being the best of the best.

Major General (Ret) John W. Collens III, the 15th Commander of the Air Weather Service, formally founded the AWA in 1987. He and his wife Barbara led the association to many successes including supporting fund raising efforts for individual and group causes (caring for our own), organizing AWA reunions every two years and growing the membership. They accomplished this all in the spirit of "Serving the Present – Remembering the Past – Air Force Weather". General Collens retired from the AWA Board of Directors at the end of 1994. To remember and honor the great unselfish work of both he and his wife, the annual AWA Awards to Outstanding Air Force Weather personnel were named the AWA John and Barbara Collens Awards.

The five AFW Awards to the outstanding airman, NCO, SNCO, company grade officer and civilian were expanded to 15 in 2006 to cover battlefield, staff and operational weather categories. The awards were also expanded over the last few years to include more Air Reserve Component categories as the Air Force Reserves and Air National Guard are increasingly involved in day-to-day operations. Individual awards number 21 for 2009.

The Air Weather Association Board of Directors is sending out congratulatory letters, cash awards and free lifetime AWA memberships as the AWA John and Barbara Collens Awards to the 21 AFW individual award winners. COL. ROBERT L. RUSSELL, Jr. - NEW AFWA COMMANDER

The Air Force Weather Agency (AFWA), Offutt AFB, NE held a change of command ceremony 20 April 2010.

Col. Robert L. Russell, Jr., assumed command from Col. John D. Murphy during a ceremony outside the Lt. Gen. Thomas S. Moorman building, AFWA's new headquarters building. "Thank you very much for this opportunity to command this great unit," Colonel Russell said. "To the men and women of the Air Force Weather Agency ... I will do everything in my power to ensure you have the right tools, training, resources and leadership to accomplish the very diverse mission set that we have to perform each and every day as an organization."

Colonel Russell moves into this position from AFWA's A-staff where he was director of strategic plans and programs since June 2008. "It's been my great pleasure the last year and a half to work with each and every one of you," Colonel Russell said. "It will now be my great honor and privilege to serve as your commander."

Maj. Gen. Marke F. Gibson, the Air Force's director of operations and deputy chief of staff for operations, plans and requirements, presided over the ceremony and officially welcomed Colonel Russell to his new position. "The warfighter focus of AFWA will continue to be crucial to future success which makes Bob Russell the perfect choice to take the stick as AFWA's next leader and commander," General Gibson said. "It's clear his focus has been on supporting our warfighters ... and that's where it needs to remain."

Colonel Russell was commissioned into the Air Force in 1986 and has served in many capacities around the world including stops at the Pentagon and with the Joint Special Operations Command at Fort Bragg, N.C. He's also commanded the 10th Combat Weather Squadron at Hurlburt Field, Fla., served as the weather operations officer for the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and has been the senior weather officer for both the Air Force and Army Special Operations Commands.

"He brings a wealth of leadership and combat experience from his many assignments," General Gibson said. "His time of running the AFWA's A5/A8 shop gives him a great head start on

running this organization. I'm confident that (he is) up to this new challenge and will deliver."

The new commander said he was impressed to see all the representatives from across Team Offutt, the various state and local officials as well as the many former Air Force weather members that attended the ceremony from across the United States. "It tells me very clearly that we are doing something right ... and that our focus is on the right stuff," Colonel Russell said. "I promise to do my best to keep that focus and I thank you again for this opportunity and I look forward to serving with you."

Colonel Murphy now heads across base to U.S. Strategic Command where he will be the deputy political advisor. He has commanded AFWA since March 2008.

AFWA is comprised of more than 1,400 active-duty members, civil service employees and contractors at 14 operating locations around the world. They provide centralized weather products and services, including climatological and space weather support, to Air Force, Army, special operations, the intelligence community and other Department of Defense activities.

AIR FORCE WEATHER PERSONNEL TRAIN IRAQIS -

The first class of Iraqi air force meteorology officers graduated 25 March 2010 from a formal technical training course in Baghdad taught by USAF weather forecasters. The Iraqi Training and Advisory Mission-Air Force have Airmen assigned to teach Iraqi personnel how to create a self sufficient and sustaining military. One such class is the weather forecaster's course, taught by Airmen from the 321st Air Expeditionary Advisory Group Air Operations Center Military Training Team. During this 52-day course, eight Iraqi military students were instructed on everything from basic weather observations to advanced weather forecast models.

"We have advised and helped the Iraq air force develop a system that is similar to the United States National Weather Service, United Kingdom's Meteorology Organization and most of the members of the World Meteorology Organization (WMO)," said Maj. Barry Hunte, 321st Military Training Team weather advisor, deployed from Keesler Air Force Base, Miss.

Despite having degrees such as meteorology or physics, the Iraqi officers have never received any type of formal aviation or military weather forecasting training. During this class the Iraqi officers received technical classroom knowledge and hands-on weather training. "We taught them how to use equipment such as the Tactical Meteorological Observation System," said Master Sgt. Mario Viray, 321st Military Training Team weather advisor. "We taught them weather observing and forecasting to WMO standards. We then helped them tailor their weather documents to fit their own unique aviation missions and base assets."

From the information taught, this inaugural class of Iraqi weather officers are now able to produce observations, terminal airdrome forecasts, daily weather briefings and issue safety-

related weather watches, warnings and advisories. "The officers will gain valuable experience everyday and they will use what we've taught them to train Iraqi officers and enlisted personnel," said Sergeant Viray, deployed from Nellis AFB, Nev.

"This is a dream come true for me," said Col. Salman Kherbat, Iraqi meteorology section director. "The American instructors have given us all their knowledge and helped us grow as an independent meteorology section. I'm very proud of these eight officers as they have sacrificed many things to complete this course." The graduates will now be sent to different locations throughout Iraq for continued on-the-job training. Once the training is complete, some of the new weather officers will become instructors while others will begin their weather mission for the Iraqi military.
