# Join in Celebrating the 75<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF AIR FORCE WEATHER (1937 – 2012)

It was 142 years ago when President Ulysses S. Grant signed a joint resolution of Congress on February 9, 1870, authorizing the secretary of war to establish a weather service under the U.S. Army Over the years that followed, Signal Service. weather functions were split off to other agencies such as to what we now know as the US National Weather Service. The US Air Force Weather function considers it officially began on July 1, 1937. On that day, The War Department transferred the responsibility for providing weather services from the Signal Corps to the Army Air Corps and the US Army Air Corps Weather Service was born. This new weather service consisted of about 280 enlisted men and 22 officers manning 40 weather stations. They were led by 1st Lt Robert M. Losey, who reported directly to the Army Air Corps Commanding General. Captain Randolph P. "Pinkie" Williams, an officer in the Army Signal Corps' Meteorological Section, is called the "Father" Air Force Weather due to his aggressive initiatives, studies and reports that helped convince leaders to transfer the meteorological service from the Signal Corps to build the kind of weather service the rapidly growing Air Corps needed.

Shortly after the US entered WW II, the Army Air Corps became the Army Air Forces (USAAF). The USAAF Commander, General Henry H. "Hap" Arnold expanded the mission of the Weather Service to include support to the Army Ground and Support Forces and by early 1945, the USAAF Weather Service reached a peak strength of 19,000. These individuals operated 900 weather stations, with

nearly 700 of those located in 58 other countries. USAAF Weather Service personnel served in all parts of the world from the ice caps of Greenland to the jungles of the Pacific. They set up stations alongside advanced airstrips; accompanied the first wave of troops storming ashore such as on Pacific Islands and the Normandy beaches; provided aerial observations; trained observers and forecasters and many other tasks still being accomplished in 2012.

Weather women joined in as the Woman's Auxiliary Army Corps was formed and soon became the Women's Army Corps (WAC). Bates and Fuller in their *America's Weather Warriors 1814-1985* indicate, "In May 1943, the first weather women began appearing at army weather stations. All told, 242 WACs performed weather duty during WW II."

These and many other historical accounts will no doubt be talked about as the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Air Force Weather is celebrated in many ways.

## **AWA & AFW ANNUAL AWARDS**

Each spring, the U.S. Air Force Director of Weather announces the winners of the Air Force Weather (AFW) Annual Awards for the previous calendar year. Your AWA also provides special recognition to the individual award winners. They are honored with the AWA John and Barbara Collens Award for being the best of the best.

Major General (Ret) John W. Collens III, Commander of the Air Weather Service (1974-1975), formally founded the AWA in 1987. He and his wife Barbara led the association to many successes including supporting fund raising efforts for individual and group causes (caring for our own), organizing AWA reunions every two years and growing the membership. They accomplished this all in the spirit of "Serving the Present – Remembering the Past – Air Force Weather". General Collens retired from the AWA Board of Directors at the end of 1994. To remember and honor the great unselfish work of both he and his wife, the annual AWA Awards to Outstanding Air Force Weather personnel were named the AWA John and Barbara Collens Awards.

The five AFW Awards to the outstanding airman, NCO, SNCO, company grade officer and civilian were expanded to 15 in 2006 to cover battlefield, staff and operational weather categories. The awards were also expanded over the last few years to include more Air Reserve Component categories as the Air Force Reserves and Air National Guard are increasingly involved in day-to-day operations. Individual awards number 25 for 2010.

A number of friends of members also departed: James Basford (2012); CMSgt Harold C. Hoffman Jr. (2011); Maj Troy Johnson (2012); Lt Col James C. Marshall (2012); Lt Col Clarence W. Neumann (2012); Lt Col Gary O'Connor Ph.D. (2012) and Maj Colin S. Reece (2010).

Two active duty friends were killed in action in Afghanistan: Capt Nathan Nylander was killed on April 27, 2011 when an Afghan military pilot opened fire during a meeting at an airport in Kabul killing nine Americans. Nate, 35, a meteorologist with the 25th Operational Weather Squadron; Davis-Monthan AFB, AZ was midway through a yearlong deployment as an adviser to the NATO Air Training Command at Kabul International Airport. On the day of the shooting, he was in a conference room with other Air Force and Afghan personnel when the gunman opened fire. Nate evacuated the room and then went into a hallway, where he and another officer fired their pistols at the gunman. Nate believed the assailant was incapacitated by his wounds and began helping the injured personnel. But, the gunman resumed the attack. Nate fired at the man again before being shot fatally. The USAF Chief of Staff, General Norman Schwartz, presented the Silver Star with Valor medal to Nate's family (wife Miriam and children Tyler, Elisabeth and Andru) at Davis-Monthan AFB. Gen Schwartz stated, "Capt Nylander could have left the building along with the people he guided outside, but he chose to stay and help those in danger. Our nation was blessed with such a brave and generous airman."

AWA members who were at the 2010 reunion in Colorado Springs will remember US Army Spc Preston Dennis from Fort Carson who spoke at the Saturday evening banquet at The Club at Peterson AFB. AWA members Al and Sue Domenech sent a sad email last May: "It is with great sorrow that we send you this message in regard to our granddaughter Heather's husband. Spc Preston Dennis was killed by an IED on April 28, 2011 in Kandahar. We of course are still mourning our great personal loss, but before he left for his second tour, he told Heather that she should be strong in case anything happened to him. She IS strong. His funeral was on May 5th, and he is interred at the Veterans' Cemetery in Igo, CA, about 30 miles west of Redding. Sue and I are fortunate to have taped his speech the night of the banquet and we have distributed it to both families. We were blessed to have known him and have that special week with them in Colorado at the AWA reunion."
